ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

In 2018, our team successfully landed five projects that will create 128 full-time equivalent jobs (FTEs), and \$4.7 million in annual payroll.



We worked directly with client partners, including: The New North, Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, site selection consultants, and real estate professionals throughout Wisconsin.

At the conclusion of 2018, we had 44 leads and 21 active projects in our prospect pipeline, with a potential to yield 620 full-time jobs and \$217 million in capital investment.

Our team proactively called on **40 existing businesses** in 2018 to identify opportunities for growth, navigate challenges, and better understand our diverse employment base.

Our business intelligence services were well utilized in 2018 with 11 clients contracting with our organization on **15 research projects.**
