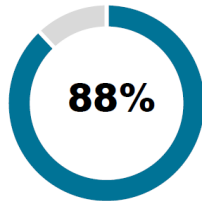


What was the impact?

Percentages reported by Interns are those responding either "Satisfied" or "Very Satisfied".

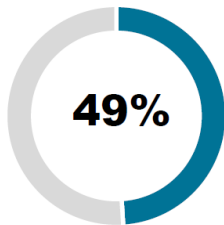
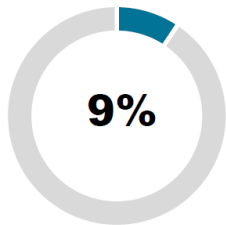


Perception of Fond du Lac County
