Supporting Business Growth

Challenges continue to impede growth within the business community. The economic development team designed, developed, and deployed a number of creative initiatives to support our businesses.

A major focus of 2021 was addressing the ever-increasing workforce shortage. There is not one magic solution that solves everyone's problem; rather, employers learned to take a multi-faceted approach.

To supplement what businesses are already doing to address this workforce shortage, Envision Greater Fond du Lac continued to offer programming and services to feed the talent funnel: Project G.R.I.L.L., Youth Apprenticeship, Summer Series for Interns and Co-Ops, Worker Relocation Incentive Program, and more.



2020-21

2021 was a year of transition for the Youth Apprenticeship program. Envision Greater Fond du Lac remains the conduit for businesses and students, but the day-to-day management of the program was transferred to CESA 6.

Fond du County area businesses are unique in that they clearly understand and continue to utilize this program to access future employees, as well as continue to rely on area high school juniors and seniors to supplement their workforce.

CAREER CONNECTIONS ACADEMY

In 2021, Career Connections Academy took a new approach to career exposure for middle school students.

Adjusting to the times, various business and non-profit organizations filmed 10 career presentations. We invited teachers to use these videos in their classroom to inform students about employment and continuing education in Fond du Lac County. Videos were curated on the website for continued use.



SUMMER SERIES

The Summer Series for Interns is a hand-crafted program exclusively created for interns and co-op students. The Series provides professional development and exposes interns to what life is like as a Fond du Lac resident. In 2021, a record 104 interns and co-ops from 13 area businesses participated.



Lemonade Day 2021 hosted 44 drive-thru stands and had 144 participants.

This program is transitioning to the UW-Extension beginning in 2022







IGNITE Small Business and Startup Support is in a realignment process to become a solution-based hub for Fond du Lac County entrepreneurs. In 2021, our small business and entrepreneur program provided 83 Fond du Lac County entrepreneurs with technical assistance and assisted in the launch of 6 new businesses.



Envision Greater Fond du Lac retooled the Fond du Lac Works website. The content was migrated to a new platform, architecture was updated, a new scrape tool was installed, and content will continue to be updated. The new site will officially launch in early 2022.



Created the framework for Fond du Lac R.O.C.K. (Retention, Opportunities, Community, Knowledge) program to engage with high school students who do not have a plan for post-high school. This program will be piloted in early 2022 with an area high school, beginning with counselor and student focus groups. Programming is expected to be rolled out in the first quarter of 2022.







In partnership with Fond du Lac County and Fond du Lac County Capital Resources, Envision Greater Fond du Lac launched in September 2021, the first-in-Wisconsin Worker Relocation Incentive Program.

- 7 completed and approved business applications
- 1 small business loan funded
- 162 resumes received.

105 business retention meetings occurred in 2021. These meetings were across industries and were used to glean information on business needs. A full report will be available by the end of Q1 2022.

The Fond du Lac County Concierge Program is a new resource offered by Envision Greater Fond du Lac, providing a suite of services to employers to enhance their talent recruitment and retention efforts.

Envision Greater Fond du Lac partnered with Fond du Lac County to complete a widescale broadband capabilities and access survey of Fond du Lac County in 2021.





Since it's inception in 2000, the Revolving Loan Fund has:

- provided \$31,480,000 in project financing
- leveraged \$9,960,000+ of private investment



Provided Business Intelligence to 20 unique businesses in Fond du Lac County. Services included: workforce analysis, economic impact analysis, industrial psychology, and market viability.

The Aeronautical Industrial Park was submitted for and granted Gold Shovel Certification in 2021. This certification enables a new business to get a shovel in the ground and open quickly.
