

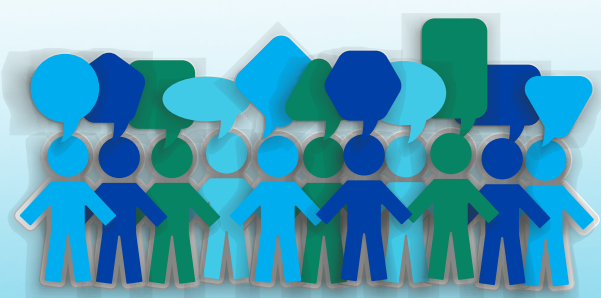


Conversations Connections Community
